- Overleaf are some examples of CIL projects and examples of the types of projects that might be considered.
- The Community Council will consult with the public at various points throughout the process and will develop a strategy to aim to ensure that all sections of our community, and different areas of our community can benefit.
- Local groups and organisations will also be approached directly as part of this consultation.

Examples of Infrastructure that can be provided or Maintained by Community Councils (The list is not exhaustive, but rather intended as a guide)

Acquire and maintain open spaces

Acquire, provide, and furnish a community building/public building/village hall

Acquire land for play areas, recreation grounds, public walks, including their maintenance

Repair and maintain public footpaths and bridleways

Lighting for roads and public places, Provide parking places, Traffic Calming measures

Provision of allotments

Provide public toilets (does not include employee wages)

Maintain, repair, and protect War Memorials

Provision of bus shelters

Litter bins

Provide public clocks
